CLARIFICATION REGARDING SELECTION FOR THE 2022 WORLD ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS

AA has come under fire on social media over the team selection for the World Championships. A number of athletes and their coaches have questioned the transparency and fairness of the selection process and brought the integrity of AA into question.

"Athletics Australia would like to clarify the nomination and selection process for the Australian team for the 2022 World Athletics Championships, following intense social media speculation. Upon nominations opening for the three major championships held in 2022 (World Athletics Championships, Commonwealth Games and World Athletics Under 20 Championships), athletes and coaches were required to read and understand the selection and nomination policies for the respective teams.

The policy for the 2022 World Athletics Championships differed this year to give athletes the flexibility in deciding to aim for up to three international teams, understanding that it is not always beneficial to compete at multiple championships within one year. We can confirm that no changes were made to the selection criteria following AA Board sign off in October 2021. Selection, as per any other year, is made by Athletics Australia's Panel of Selectors; an independent group appointed by the Athletics Australia Board, whose purpose is to determine the composition of Australian teams.

Despite this process, we acknowledge that the policy was not well understood, which brought the integrity of AA into question, and we deeply apologise for this.

We also apologise for miscommunication that occurred between an athlete and an AA staff member regarding automatic selection, however this was rectified by AA's Chair of Selectors; the only person authorised to speak on selection matters. To avoid this happening again, we are now looking at improving methods of communication moving forward to ensure the correct information is broadcast as soon as a policy is published. At this time and always, we put the mental health and wellbeing of athletes first, and we ask you that you respect their privacy at this time. We do remain concerned about unfounded allegations affecting their wellbeing. Athletics Australia acknowledges that there has been significant commentary on social media in recent days, some of which breaches AA's Code of Conduct. AA will not be publishing any material on social media in order to respect the rights and opinions of the Australian athletics community.

If any athletes have concerns about their wellbeing, please reach out to AA's Athlete Wellbeing & Engagement Manager, Melanie Purkiss (melanie.purkiss@athletics.org.au). Athletics Australia has a range of integrity policies and if any members of the community feel that there has been a breach of those policies, they can reach out to AA's National Integrity and Risk Manager, Simon Thompson (simon.thompson@athletics.org.au) should there be concerns about integrity matters both at AA or within the community. Athletes and coaches at the World Athletics Championships and/or the Commonwealth Games are able to speak directly to AA President and CEO, Jan Swinhoe and Peter Bromley who will make themselves available at any time during either of the championships."

World Athletics Championships: Kelly Ruddick to become oldest ever female competitor, aged 49



Australia's Kelly Ruddick is set to become the oldest ever female competitor at the World Athletics Championships, aged 49.

She was selected by Athletics Australia for the 35km race walk at this month's championships in Eugene, Oregon.It will be Ruddick's debut appearance at the showpiece, after missing out in 2015 with an ear infection.

"It means much more to her now than it would mean to others, I'm sure," her father Kevin said. "Every time she's had a chance something has gone wrong.

"She's thought it was all over. It's an incredible achievement that all these years later she's here again."

Race walker Jesus Angel Garcia of Spain is the oldest person to have competed at the World Championships, racing in his 13th edition, also at the age of 49, in Doha in 2019.Portugal's Joao Vieira is the oldest athlete to have won a medal in World Championship history when he took silver aged 43 in the race walk in 2019.Athletics Australia also named the youngest athlete for this year's championships, with 17-year-old Claudia Hollingsworth competing in the 800m.

Congratulations to Kirsten Crocker who will be one of five Australian officials at the World Championships and at the Commonwealth Games as an International Race Walk Judge.

British racewalker Tom Bosworth says he will retire from athletics at the end of this season.

Tom Bosworth, who was runner up to Dane Bird-Smith in that epic 20km at the 2018 Gold Coast Commonwealth Games, has announced he will retire from the sport after the Birmingham Commonwealth Games in August.

The 32-year-old won silver in the men's 20km race walk at the 2018 Commonwealth Games when he set a British record of one hour 19 minutes and 38 seconds.

His last major event is set to be this year's Commonwealth Games in Birmingham from 28 July to 8 August. "Hopefully, I can celebrate everything I've achieved by having one last big amazing summer," said Bosworth. "Competing at a home Commonwealth Games is just the perfect way to go out."

Bosworth was sixth in the 20km race walk at the Rio Games in 2016 and finished seventh in the same event at the 2019 World Championships in Doha.

He was disqualified from the 20km race walk at the World Championships in 2017. "Its not been an easy decision to make. It's not one I've rushed into but now feels like the right time,". "I cannot believe what I have managed to achieve. I just started athletics for fun and fitness so, to have had the career I have had, I feel so lucky and privileged."

Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games

The Commonwealth Games will be held from Thursday 28 July to Monday 8 August with the Athletics competitions to be conducted from Tuesday 2 August through to Sunday 7 August at Alexander Stadium.

Handicap Points - What does it all mean?

At the end of the season trophies are awarded to the first three places, male and female, in each grade based on total accumulated points from club Handicap race meets during the season. For each grade the following table indicates the points to be allocated for each week's handicap races for males and females.

Starting points are awarded for starting the event.

Completed points are awarded for finishing the race distance.

The **Best Season Performance.** To be awarded handicap points for the best season performance, the member must have competed in a prior Racewalking Queensland or Queensland Athletics road walking event over the same distance during the current winter season.

To be eligible for Handicap Trophies a member must participate in a minimum of 50% of designated Handicap Races during the season.

Handicap points are awarded to the top 7 place-getters within the sealed or non-sealed handicaps as per the above table. The member placed 1st, based on the handicap results, receives the highest points while the member placed 7th, based on the handicap results, receives the least points, thus a member winning the handicap for the A grade men could be awarded a maximum of 115 points.

ORWC & QA membership

The QRWC membership year runs from 1 October to 30 September the following year. Memberships can be taken out or renewed at any time during this period. You don't have to wait until the start of the winter road walking season in April to join QRWC or renew your membership. All memberships taken out on or after 1 October 2021 will be valid until 30 September 2022 and will cover the 2022 winter road walking season.

When looking at QRWC membership options, there are basically two types:

- 1. Standalone QRWC membership -or-
- 2. Combining QRWC membership with a Queensland Athletics (QA) membership. Standalone QRWC Membership

QRWC membership covers all QRWC race days as well as QRWC championships. Note: race fees are in addition to membership fees. There are two membership options: student (\$15) and non-student (\$25). This level of membership would be suitable for athletes wishing to compete at QRWC races only, or athletes wishing to attend QA events who are already a member of another QA club (refer to the following for details about QA events). Combined QRWC/QA Membership

QA conducts a number of events throughout the year, including approximately 4 or 5 racewalking events held over the summer months as well as the QA Qld Road Walking Championships (usually held in July each year). In order to compete at these events, QA requires athletes to take out membership with QA and also be a member of a club that is affiliated with QA - QRWC is one such club.

QA memberships become due on 1 October each year and are valid until 30 September the following year. The QRWC membership year is aligned with the QA membership year which means that athletes wishing to compete at QA events can obtain a combined QA/QRWC membership in or after October each year, which covers the QA summer season events (October to March) and the Qld Road Walking Championships in July. This combined membership also includes the QRWC winter road walking season (ie. the traditional Sunday morning races held from April to September). This allows members wishing to compete in both QA and QRWC events, to take out membership for both organisations in one transaction. In fact, we already have a number of QRWC members who have renewed their QRWC membership for the 2022 winter season and have been competing at QA events over the summer months. Given that this membership extends until September 30 this year, they will also be covered for the Qld Road Walking Championships in July (approx.) and QRWC races held in the winter months.
